Sexual Impurity (5:1-13) (We are here) Lawsuits (6:1-11) Fornication (6:12-20) Marriage (7:1-40) observe

It is actually reported that there is sexual immorality among you, and the kind of sexual immorality that is not even tolerated among the Gentiles—a man is sleeping with his father's wife. And you are arrogant! Shouldn't you be filled with grief and remove from your congregation the one who did this? Even though I am absent in the body, I am present in spirit. As one who is present with you in this way, I have already pronounced judgment on the one who has been doing such a thing. When you are assembled in the name of our Lord Jesus, and I am with you in spirit, with the power of our Lord Jesus, hand that one over to Satan for the destruction of the flesh, so that his spirit may be saved in the day of the Lord.

Your boasting is not good. Don't you know that a little leaven leavens the whole batch of dough?

Clean out the old leaven so that you may be a new

unleavened batch, as indeed you are. For Christ our Passover lamb has been sacrificed. Therefore, let us observe the feast, not with old leaven or with the leaven of malice and evil, but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth.

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CHURCH DISCIPLINE

I wrote to you in a letter not to associate with sexually immoral people. I did not mean the immoral people of this world or the greedy and swindlers or idolaters; otherwise you would have to leave the world. But actually, I wrote you not to associate with anyone who claims to be a brother or sister and is sexually immoral or greedy, an idolater or verbally abusive, a drunkard or a swindler. Do not even eat with such a person. For what business is it of mine to judge outsiders? Don't you judge those who are inside? God judges outsiders. **Remove the evil person from among you.**

I've broken this text up into the following major outlines:

- 1. Sexual Immorality Within Corinth
- 2. A Call to Cleanse Ourselves of Leaven
- 3. Warning to Not Associate With Sexually Immoral People

Within each section, I've determined the following themes

1. Sexual Immorality Within Corinth

- 1. A report of Sexual Immorality reaches Paul.
 - 1. This sexual immorality is severe even the gentiles would not tolerate it.
 - 2. Someone is sleeping with their fathers wife.
- 2. The church is arrogant
 - 1. They should be grieved by this occurring in their midsts, but instead, seem indifferent to what is happening.
- 3. Hand the person over
 - 1. Paul condemns the person to be handed over to Satan.
 - 2. Even this, is so that the soul of the person may be saved.
- 2. A Call to Cleanse Ourselves of Leaven
 - 1. A little leaven leavens the full bath
 - 2. Cleanse yourselves
 - 3. Christ died for us
 - 1. Therefore, let us be sincere and truthful.
- 3. Warning to Not Associate With Sexual Immoral People.
 - 1. Paul wrote to not associate with immoral people.
 - 1. But not people of the world.
 - 2. Rather, those of the inside (within the church).
 - 3. Remove evil people from among us.

- 3. Explanation: (5:9-13)

I still find my main outline to give a proper overview of the chapter, however, I find the outline provided by Curtis Vaughan to be better suited for a sermon.

Leon Morris outlines the passage very similar to the way I do, but adds a clarification to the "explanation" section. Pauls writing in verses 9-13 is less of an explanation and more of a clearing up a misunderstanding from a previous writing.



Sense: midst (location) – the location of something surrounded by other things.

BDAG middle, in the middle.; among.
